Dr. Sudip Bose is an attending emergency medicine physician and combat veteran. He served as a physician on the front lines during Operation Iraqi Freedom for nearly 15 months, one of the longest combat deployments by a physician since World War II. Dr. Bose treated Saddam Hussein shortly after his capture in December 2003. For his service, he received Presidential recognition and was awarded the Bronze Star and Army Commendation Medal. Dr. Bose is championing efforts to raise awareness and funding for wounded veterans and the families of fallen soldiers, especially those with post-traumatic stress disorder.
